OCEANS20 COMMUNIQUÉ A Call to G20 Leadership

Driving Economic Prosperity, Climate Action, and Security through Ocean Stewardship.



The seven key recommendations of Brazil's Oceans20* to the G20 leaders were:

- 1. Ensure a Clean, Healthy, and Productive Ocean
- 2. Expand Sustainable Aquatic Food Systems
- 3. Scale Up Offshore Wind Energy
- 4. Enhance Maritime Governance for Sustainable Shipping
- 5. Incentivize Ocean Finance
- 6. Improve Maritime Security
- 7. Strengthen Global Coordination

The ten priority themes identified in the Oceans20* Communique are:

- 1. Promoting a sustainable and equitable ocean economy
- 2. Advancing an ambitious, inclusive climate and just energy transition
- 3. Fostering food security and sustainable fisheries practices
- 4. Conserving and restoring marine resources and ecosystems
- 5. Strengthening inclusive and adaptive ocean governance
- 6. Social inclusion and just transition
- 7. Enhancing ocean policy coherence and integration
- 8. Fostering cooperative science and innovation
- 9. Stimulating public-private-philanthropic partnerships
- 10. Accelerating ocean finance




Uniting for Inclusive and Sustainable Ocean Development:

Advancing Cooperative Innovation and Partnerships

Ocean20SA theme:

Uniting for Inclusive and Sustainable Development: Advancing Cooperative Innovation and Partnerships for Action.

Using the concept of the **quadruple helix**, which will bring together **academia**, **industry**, **government** and **civil society** to address complex challenges







Ocean Actions are targeted, solution-oriented interventions designed to tackle critical ocean challenges in practical, measurable, and inclusive ways.

Purpose and Objectives:

- **1. Action** high-level recommendations from the Brazilian Oceans20 Communique into tangible, onthe-ground interventions.
- 2. Foster partnerships and networks across sectors and regions for shared, co-designed solutions.
- **3.** Equip least and less developed regions and countries with the tools and knowledge capacity needed to address ocean challenges, from environmental and resource-use management to disaster risk reduction.
- 4. Align local, national and regional efforts with global imperatives

[such as the UN 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), the Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) Kunming – Montreal 30x30, the Biodiversity Beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ) High Seas Treaty, the Ocean Panel's Ocean Action 2030 Agenda and South Africa's G20 Solidarity, Equality, and Sustainability agenda].



5. Advance the position of the Global South in ocean imperatives towards 2030 and beyond.



The guiding principles of the Ocean Actions are:

- **1. Inclusivity**: Engaging stakeholders across the Quadruple Helix to ensure diverse transdisciplinary perspectives, partnerships and equitable solutions to ocean challenges.
- 2. Practicality: Implementable actions that deliver measurable outcomes.
- **3. Sustainability**: Promoting long-term solutions that balance environmental, economic, and social priorities.
- **4. Collaboration**: Encouraging partnerships & shared responsibility among stakeholders.



5. Creating legacies: Through Ocean20 Actions, we want to ensure longevity beyond 2025 of SA's G20 Presidency, towards and beyond the UN's Agenda 2030 and the UN Ocean Science Decade 2021-2030.











Expected outcomes:

- 1. Strengthened partnerships for blue financing and implementation of ocean initiatives.
- **2.** Increased capacity of African scientists and policymakers to address ocean challenges.
- 3. Practical frameworks and tools for sustainable ocean governance and management.
